4. What did Steve do next day? Next day he wanted to go to the walking tour but it was cancelled.

5. What did he do that night? That night he went to bed at 7 p.m.

6. What was the weather on the second day of Steve's trip? It was stormy.


7. Why was the museum closed on the first day of Steve's trip? Steve arrived late at Edinburgh, that's why the museum was closed.
